Freedom of information application

I refer to your application under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act), received by the Office of the Minister for Human Services on 6 February 2019 seeking access to:

Since 17 March 2018, copies of all correspondence (including but not limited to hardcopy or electronic letter, emails, diary entries and any other correspondence) from the Member for Newland, Richard Harvey MP.

After consultation with your office on the 8 March 2019, it was agreed to combine two of the freedom of information requests as referenced above, into one response.

Unfortunately, a determination was unable to made within the 30 days, therefore it is considered to be a 'deemed refusal' under section 19(2)(b) of the Act. However, our office has continued to process your application outside of this timeframe. Section 19(2)(a) of the Act provides that an agency can release documents outside of the thirty-day timeframe, and this is still taken to be a determination under the Act.

Six documents have been identified as falling within the scope of your application and I have determined to release these documents in part.

Documents 1-6 contain personal information in relation to a third party and I consider that the release of this information would be an unreasonable disclosure of information related to the third party's personal affairs and have determined it to be exempt pursuant to clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 of the Act.

Please find enclosed a copy of the documents, and a document schedule containing a brief description of the documents.

If you are dissatisfied with my determination, you can seek an internal review by writing to the Minister for Human Services as the Principal Officer of the agency. Your request should be sent within 30 days of your receipt of this letter.

In accordance with the requirements of Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045, details of your FOI application, and the documents to which you are given access, may/will be published on the agency's disclosure log. 



Housing SA (HSA) takes reports of disruption and anti-social behaviour seriously and investigates all complaints in accordance with its Disruptive Behaviour Policy. I am advised both tenancies have been referred to the Modbury Regional Response Team for support and intervention regarding the complaints. In addition, both parties have accepted a referral to a regional Tenancy Practitioner for support with their tenancies. It is hoped this will see a reduction in the conflict between the tenancies.





concerns about the behaviour of Housing SA (HSA) tenant,

HSA takes reports of disruption very seriously and investigates all complaints in line with the Disruptive Behaviour Policy. I am informed that the tenant has been made aware that further substantiated complaints or other breaches of her conditions of tenancy may place her tenancy at risk. However, neighbours who have been affected may wish to explore other options available to them through the South Australian Civil and Administrative Tribunal (SACAT), who can be contacted on 1800 723 767, or through their website www.sacat.sa.gov.au.

I understand that HSA have assessed tenancy and support needs and allocated a Tenancy Practitioner to assist her to resolve neighbour concerns about her behaviour. HSA continue to actively monitor tenancy and are also working with medical and other supports for her.

I ask that you encourage your constituents to report further concerns or anti-social behaviour to HSA by calling 131 299. This will enable prompt and appropriate action to be taken. If they feel unsafe, your constituents can call South Australia Police on 131 444 for assistance or 000 in an emergency.
