

DISCUSSION

The Department sponsors the Department of Human Services Aboriginal Achievement Award, which recognises young Aboriginal people for their contributions to the Aboriginal and broader community, acknowledges the barriers they have overcome and celebrates leadership and cultural achievements.

The three finalists for the Department for Human Services Aboriginal Achievement Award are:

- **Christine Glenn, 29 of Elizabeth North**
Christine is the founder of the Kaleteya Netball Club and now manages several teams with 200 members. She is the co-creator and vice-president of the SA Aboriginal Junior Football Carnival. Through the South Australian Aboriginal Sports Training Academy, Christine coaches young netball players. This year she is implementing the Netball SA Inaugural Reconciliation Action Plan, which she worked on throughout 2017.
- **Kyran Dixon, 24 of Albion**
Kyran is a proud member of the Kaurna and Narungga clan. Battling cancer twice, he maintained tertiary studies through chemotherapy. He is now employed by Ernst & Young and promotes cancer awareness and research as co-founder of the Aboriginal Youth Cancer Advisory Group. He was the 2017 SA NAIDOC Young Person of the Year. He participates in SANFL charity rounds and has raised funds for the World's Greatest Shave.
- **Mikayla Hudson, 21 of Port Augusta**
Mikayla was named Port Augusta's 2017 NAIDOC Youth of the Year. With a bachelor's degree in Psychological Science, she is now studying a Masters of Occupational Therapy. Mikayla provides feedback on hospitals in the Flinders and Upper North as an Aboriginal youth representative for Country Health SA. She also advised Country Health Connect Services about how changes to rural Hospital services and programs could affect Aboriginal and wider communities.

The Office for Youth has been a sponsor of the Awards since 2004. Each year, the Office for Youth has provided \$9,500 (GST exclusive) to Awards Australia as a naming rights sponsor of the Aboriginal Achievement Award.


