Dear Ms Cook

I refer to your application under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act), received by the Department of Human Services (DHS) on 5 February 2019, seeking access to:

Copies of any and all documents (including but not limited to physical and electronic material) regarding DHS, SAHT, SAHA or Ministerial Paper 18MHS/0694.

Unfortunately, DHS was unable to make a determination on your application within the 30 days, therefore it is considered to be a 'deemed refusal' under section 19(2)(b) of the Act. However, DHS has continued to process your application outside of this timeframe. Section 19(2)(a) of the Act provides that an agency can release documents outside of the thirty-day timeframe, and this is still taken to be a determination under the Act.

Two documents were located that fit within the scope of your request and I have determined to release these documents in full. Please find enclosed a copy of the documents released, and a document schedule containing a brief description of each document and determination in summary form.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this brief is to provide a response letter to Ms Nat Cook MP, Member for Hurtle Vale regarding the cessation of Southern Connections.

KEY POINTS

- Northern and Southern Connections ceased to operate from 1 July 2018.
- Southern Connections led innovation and youth entrepreneurial initiatives by supporting the ongoing development and implementation of the HIPHUB youth entrepreneurial initiative.
- A Southern Adelaide resident has raised concerns to Ms Cook about the cessation of Southern Connections and its impact on building local community.
- Ms Cook is seeking advice to be included in the response to the constituent.

RISKS/SENSITIVITIES - Nil

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DISCUSSION

Established in 2009, Southern Connections has contributed to efforts to improve social and economic outcomes in southern Adelaide by aligning the resources and activities of the three levels of government, not for profits, business and other local stakeholders to respond to issues of regional significance.

Southern Connections led innovation and youth entrepreneurial initiatives by supporting the ongoing development and implementation of the HIPHUB youth entrepreneurial initiative. In 2017-18, Southern Connections continued its role as an active partner in social planning involving the four southern Adelaide Councils - Marion, Mitcham, Holdfast and Onkaparinga - across public health plans and social procurement.

In the area of Social Impact Investing, Southern Connections also investigated and trialled new models of funding and delivering social services to the public using social impact tools to mobilise private investment in the sector.

Initiatives managed by Southern Connections were generally catalyst projects funded to 30 June 2018, designed to be delivered by partners beyond the initial funding period. For example, two programs (with a youth employment focus) that are continuing are the HIPHUB youth entrepreneurial initiative and the Be a Job Maker program, both which are being delivered by several partners.

The Department of Human Services (DHS) Community Services Division previously funded Southern Connections and Northern Connections, both of which ceased to operate from 1 July 2018.

This is a Budget savings measure to direct funding into areas identified by government as a higher priority. Savings of approximately \$700,000 per annum (indexed) have been identified through this measure.

Funding for Beyond Auto was to cease on 30 June 2018, however the Department for Industry and Skills has extended funding for an additional three months.

DHS will continue to maintain local partnerships in the southern region through the Youth Strategy, engaging with entrepreneurial programs, and the Regional Partnerships team as they continue their work with local government, NGOS and regional stakeholders.
