#### Freedom of information application

I refer to your application under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act), received by the Office of the Minister for Human Services on 20 February 2019 seeking access to:

After consultation with your office on the 8 March 2019, it was agreed to combine two of the freedom of information requests as referenced above, into one response.

Unfortunately, a determination was unable to made within the 30 days, therefore it is considered to be a 'deemed refusal' under section 19(2)(b) of the Act. However, our office has continued to process your application outside of this timeframe. Section 19(2)(a) of the Act provides that an agency can release documents outside of the thirty-day timeframe, and this is still taken to be a determination under the Act.

Five documents have been identified as falling within the scope of your application and I have determined to release one document in part and two documents in full.

Documents 1-5 contain personal information of a third party and I consider that the release of this information would be an unreasonable disclosure of information

related to the third partys' personal affairs and have determined it to be exempt pursuant to clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 of the Act.

Please find enclosed a copy of the documents, and a document schedule containing a brief description of the documents.

If you are dissatisfied with my determination, you can seek an internal review by writing to the Minister for Human Services as the Principal Officer of the agency. Your request should be sent within 30 days of your receipt of this letter.

In accordance with the requirements of Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045, details of your FOI application, and the documents to which you are given access, may/will be published on the agency's disclosure log. raised with me, among a number of practical matters that they are encountering as they assist to navigate the early days of the transition to NDIS, the matter of In Kind support. Advised me that they have found that In Kind support is included as a default component of plan, and that this is a service notionally provided by the Department of Human Services. They further advised that, after enquiry to the provider, they understand that should the In-Kind service not be required, it would be necessary for to undertake a plan review or to obtain a new plan in order to reallocate those resources. In this regard, they referred to a document headed, "Releasing Clients from in kind arrangements July news from DHS", which provides guidance indicating that in-kind programs should be treated flexibly, and setting out means and reasons for exiting those arrangements.

I raise the matter of In Kind services, and the particular experience of the conscious that the NDIA transition is in its early days. I should be grateful for your advice in relation to the matter of In Kind services, and in particular arrangements flexibly to exit those services in case they not required.

# Releasing Clients from In-Kind arrangements July news from DHS

The South Australian Government is committed to the objectives of the NDIS, including ensuring that the South Australian NDIS market can grow by supporting people's requests to exit in-kind arrangements. DHS has provided advice to the NDIA that all State Government in-kind programs should be treated flexibly, with any client wishing to choose a different provider being supported to do so with cash funding within their NDIA Plan. This can be actioned by individual requests being made to NDIA planners, which are then escalated to the relevant NDIA Team Leader and the DHS delegate (Manager, In-Kind Unit, Disability Community Services).

The NDIA requires evidence as to why a participant should be released from their in-kind arrangements, in compliance with the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) (Plan Management) Rules 2013 (the Rules), which apply nationally. The NDIA is then obliged to record the reason for the exit from in-kind arrangements. Reasons for exiting include:

- the in-kind support is not available to the person (e.g. outside of metro area)
- the person was not part of the in-kind program, and has no existing relationship with the provider (e.g. they were registered for support coordination, but had minimal contact with Disability SA)
- there has been a breakdown in the relationship between the client with the in-kind provider which cannot be repaired.

DHS is continuing to work closely with the NDIA regarding the In-Kind Services release process and the NDIA is committed to reinforcing messages with its planning staff, including Local Area Coordinators, about the in-kind release process and the importance of timely action.





Thank you for your email on behalf of regarding Royal Society for the Blind's (RSB) concerns about the recent decision of the Federal Government to reduce available contractors under the Print Disability Services Program.

RSB provides valuable support to those affected by vision impairment within South Australia.

The Federal Government has recently removed funding for the RSB to transcribe and translate Braille, audio and large print at no charge to their clients within South Australia.

Under the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), funding for disability services is shifting from the State to the Federal Government. The NDIS is a new way of providing support for people living with a disability, their families and carers and is administered by the Federal Government through the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA).

While the responsibility of the NDIS lies with the Federal Government, I am committed to ensuring quality of care and services for all South Australians and will continue to advocate on behalf of individuals and organisations.

As the State Minister for Human Services I was concerned about the potential impact the Federal Government's decision may have on vision impaired clients in South Australia.



I have written to the Federal Minister for Social Services regarding the decision to remove funding from RSB and have sought reassurance that South Australians with a vision impairment are not disadvantaged by the decision.

The State Government will continue to support the aspirations and goals of the NDIS and its participants with policies and initiatives, such as the new Disability Inclusion Act, which came into effect 1 July.
