Freedom of information application

I refer to your application under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act), received by the Office of the Minister for Human Services on 26 June 2018 seeking access to:

Copies of any and all documents (including but not limited to physical and electronic material) regarding DHS Signed Briefing by Minister Lensink 18MHS/0101.

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of my determination.

Two documents have been located that fall within the scope of your application, and I have determined to release both documents in part. The documents contain the mobile phone numbers and personal email addresses of third parties, personal information that I consider would be unreasonable to disclose and have determined to be exempt pursuant to clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 of the Act.

Section 20(4) of the Act provides that if it is practicable to give access to a copy of a document with exempt matter deleted, and it appears that the applicant would wish to be given such a copy, the agency must give access to a copy of the document to this limited extent.

If you are dissatisfied with my determination, you can seek an internal review by writing to the Minister for Human Services as the Principal Officer of the agency. Your request should be sent within 30 days of your receipt of this letter.

In accordance with the requirements of Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045, details of your FOI application, and the documents to which you are given access, will be published on the agency's disclosure log. The Mission Australia Board is meeting in Adelaide on 1st & 2nd May and after discussions with

Dean Brown who serves on our Board, we thought the visit would be a good opportunity for you to meet our Chairman, Ken Dean and new CEO James Toomey. Chris Bratchford our Executive of Mission Australia Housing appreciated the opportunity of meeting you last year to explore opportunities for provision of social and affordable housing in South Australia under a Liberal Government and is interested in continuing discussions with you.

You will be aware that Mission Australia is a large non-denominational Christian charity providing community, housing and early learning services throughout Australia. With the goal of reducing homelessness and strengthening communities we work with families and children, young people, and older people experiencing homelessness and also provide specialist services for those impacted by mental health, disability and alcohol and drug issues. In South Australia our expanding services include:

- Transition to Work and Youth Offenders Prevention;
- Adult Community Education & Transition to Work;
- Personal Helpers and Mentors and Partners in Recovery.

In addition:

- We are funded by the Adelaide Primary Health Network to provide youth drug & alcohol support programs through our Hindmarsh Centre and by the Department of Social Services to provide family mental health support services in Whyalla and Pt Augusta;
- Flexible Learning Options (FLO) across metropolitan Adelaide and The Riverland region, funded by the Department of Education and Child Development.

Appreciating your diary is no doubt filling up leading into the upcoming session of Parliament, I'd be keen to see if we could find a time on 1st or 2nd May to introduce you to Ken and James accompanied by Dean and Chris Bratchford. 

This meeting has been requested by Mission Australia in order for them to discuss the provision of social and affordable housing in South Australia, and to describe to you some of their initiatives and programs. They would also like to hear about your priorities in the Human Services portfolio.

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Mission Australia is a non-denominational Christian charity that is active across Australia. Nationally, Mission Australia provides services in relation to homelessness support, crisis and transitional accommodation, social and affordable housing, early learning, youth, disability, mental health, employment skills and training, and alcohol and other drug dependency. In South Australia, the organisation currently provides programs including:

- case management for young people experiencing conflict at home, or at risk of homelessness
- employment support for young people, youth offenders, and adults
- adult community education
- mental health recovery
- assistance accessing the NDIS
- youth drug and alcohol support
- family mental health support
- case management for young people disengaged from education.

Mission Australia did not receive any funding in 2017-18 from any division of the Department for Human Services, nor from Renewal SA. The organisation receives funding from several other State and Federal departments.
