Freedom of information application

I refer to your application under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act), received by the Office of the Minister for Human Services on 22 June 2018 seeking access to:

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of my determination.

I have determined that fourteen documents fall within the scope of your application and are listed in the attached document schedule. Access will be granted as determined by each document listed in the schedule.

Section 20(4) of the Act provides that if it is practicable to give access to a copy of a document with exempt matter deleted, and it appears that the applicant would wish to be given such a copy, the agency must give access to a copy of the document to this limited extent.

The documents listed in the schedule as determined to be released in part contain identifying details of a third party. I consider that the release of this information would be an unreasonable disclosure of information related to the third party's personal affairs, and have determined it to be exempt pursuant to clause 6(1) of Schedule 1 of the Act.

If you are dissatisfied with my determination, you can seek an internal review by writing to the Minister for Human Services as the Principal Officer of the agency. Your request should be sent within 30 days of your receipt of this letter.



KEY POINTS

- The Grants SA Minor Round 10 was open from 1 January 2018 to 28 February 2018. During this period, 69 applications were received from not for profit organisations requesting \$280,136.
- During the pre-eligibility check, 19 applications were deemed ineligible, due to the type of organisation/activity or missing documentation (attachment 1). The ineligible applicants were notified via email on 14 March 2018.
- The total eligible funding requested by the 50 eligible applicants was \$184,671.
- The total funding available to allocate for this round was \$156,981.

DISCUSSION

Background

The Grants SA program provides over \$3 million in grants annually to not-for-profit community organisations to improve community participation, wellbeing and quality of life for South Australians, particularly those who are experiencing persistent or relative disadvantage.

Grants SA brings together four one-off grant programs: the Charitable and Social Welfare Fund, Multicultural SA - Celebrating Diversity one-off grants, Volunteer Training Grants, and the Volunteer Support Fund - into a single application process.

Organisations can apply for any of the eligible funding streams with just one application. Major grant rounds of \$20,001 to \$50,000 are open twice a year; medium grants of \$5,001 to \$20,000 are open four times a year; and minor grants of up to \$5,000 are open all year round and assessed at the end of each month.

Grants SA has reduced red tape, simplified grant processes and made it easier for community groups to access grants.

Opening the grant all year round with more flexible guidelines has increased the accessibility for a wider variety of groups.

Grant processes have been simplified with all funding assessed against the same criteria and allocated on merit. Applicants use the same system to apply, receive payment, report and acquit their funding.

There are two Grants SA assessment panels, comprising members from the former Charitable and Social Welfare Fund assessment panel, the South Australian Multicultural and Ethnic Affairs Commission, external community members as well as DCSI officers.

The assessment of all grant applications involve the following stages:

- The eligibility check, organisational capacity and value for money criteria are assessed by the DCSI grants team.
- Grant applications between \$5,000 and \$50,000 are assessed by an independent panel made up of seven community panel members, and one senior member from the Department of Human Services Community Services Division. Two of the community panel members are South Australian Multicultural and Ethnic Affairs Commission (SAMEAC) members.
- Grant applications up to \$5,000 are assessed by a panel made up of three members from the Department of Human Services Community Services Division, and one member of SAMEAC.
- Applications are individually scored online by each of the panel members against community need, outcomes focus and extent of benefit for the target group.
- These scores are ranked and allocations are made for each project against an eligible funding stream - Charitable and Social Welfare Fund, Multicultural SA, Volunteers and Youth.

- The panels meet to discuss the reports and recommend successful applicants, based on the final whole of program distribution criteria and the amount of funding available per stream/round.
- The Minister's delegate, the Executive Director, Community Services, approves all Purchase Recommendations.

In 2016-17, Grants SA provided \$3m in funding to support 318 projects:

- \$2.3m was from the Charitable and Social Welfare fund, which supports community members experiencing disadvantage;
- \$450,000 was from the Multicultural funding stream which supports culturally and linguistically diverse communities; and
- \$250,000 was from the Volunteering funding stream which supports volunteers.

Details of recipients of the Grants SA major, medium and minor grant rounds are published on the Grants SA website.

Notifying Grants SA Minor Round 10 Recipients

The purpose of this briefing is to note the outcome of the Grants SA Minor Round 10 which was open from 1 January 2018 to 28 February 2018.

The Grants SA Minor Assessment Panel members individually assessed all 50 applications online, in accordance with the published Grants SA Guidelines. The panel comprised four members: one representative from the South Australian Multicultural and Ethnic Affairs Commission (SAMEAC), Mr Hiep Nguyen and three Community Services staff members, Ms Jessica Cabban, Mr Chris Karvountzis and Ms Sue Sansome.

On 21 March 2018, the Panel met to deliberate and recommended the allocation of \$144,835 (GST exclusive) in funding to 39 organisations (attachment 2).

Draft congratulatory letters have been prepared for your signature (attachment 4). Notification was to occur on 11 April 2018.

The Executive Director, Community Services Division, will sign letters of notification to the 28 unsuccessful organisations. A list of unsuccessful applicants is attached for your information (attachment 4).

Grants SA has one final round for 2017-18, Minor Round 11, which was open from 1 March 2018 to 31 March 2018.

The Department is currently preparing a briefing, regarding opening the 2018-19 Grants SA program on 1 May 2018, and will be forwarding it to your office shortly.





On 30 May 2018, you met with the Hon Jing Lee MLC, Assistant Minister to the Premier and Department of Human Services (DHS) officials and agreed to open the 2018-19 Grants SA program, including the \$405,000 of Multicultural SA funding currently integrated within the program, during June 2018.

DISCUSSION

Following your meeting with the Assistant Minister to the Premier and DHS officials on 30 May 2018, your formal approval is sought to open the 2018-19 Grants SA program on Monday 18 June 2018.

Grants SA provides \$3.2 million in grants annually to improve community participation, wellbeing and quality of life for South Australians, particularly those who are experiencing disadvantage.

Grants SA brings together four one-off grant programs: the Charitable and Social Welfare Fund, Multicultural SA - Celebrating Diversity one-off grants, Volunteer Training Grants, and the Volunteer Support Fund – into a single application process.

The 2018-19 budget for this program is \$3.2 million.

Promotion of the program, targeting community organisations, will be undertaken through DHS e-newsletters, websites and social media, as well as promoting to key stakeholder networks. The department's Communications and Engagement Directorate will also liaise with your office, and the Premier's office, to prepare a media release for your consideration.

To gain further exposure, it is proposed that you write to Members of Parliament and Mayors of local councils, advising them of the opening of applications for these grants. A draft letter and mail merge data listing intended recipients are included as attachment 1.

A draft Minister's message for emailing to a range of stakeholders, including DHS grant recipients and Grants SA panel members, as well as volunteer and multicultural networks, is attached for your consideration. The DHS Communications and Engagement Directorate will be in contact with you shortly, regarding the preparation of a Minister's message email template, which you may like to use to distribute this message (refer attachment 2).

The Grants SA Funding Guidelines are attached for your reference (refer attachment 3).

It is important to note that opening Grants SA 2018-19 will have implications for the transfer of resources as part of the multicultural Machinery of Government (MOG) changes, as DHS will continue to administer the grant rounds and funds into 2018-19. An appropriate agreement to support this arrangement will be determined between the departments.

Further to this matter, \$1 million in funding from the Charitable Social Welfare Fund, formerly distributed through Fund My Community, has been quarantined separately, with this allocation to be determined at a later date.



About the program

Grants SA provides over \$3 million in grants annually to community organisations to improve community participation, wellbeing and quality of life for South Australians, particularly those who are experiencing persistent or relative disadvantage.

Grants SA brings together three of the Department of Human Services (DHS) one-off grant programs:

- Charitable and Social Welfare Fund (Community Benefit SA);
- Multicultural Grants: and
- Volunteer Grants.

Community organisations only have to apply once to be considered for funding across all of these program streams.

Funds will be distributed through major, medium and minor funding rounds. Major grant rounds of \$20,001 to \$50,000 will be open twice a year, medium grants of \$5,001 to \$20,000 will be open four times a year and minor grants of up to \$5,000 will be open all year round and assessed at the end of every second month.

Organisations are eligible to be successful for a maximum of three grants per financial year.

Key priorities

The priority groups for Grants SA funding are as follows.

- People and/or communities experiencing disadvantage, meaning those with less access to social and economic opportunities;
- Culturally and linguistically diverse groups and communities; and
- Volunteers.

Refer to the Glossary of terms for more detailed definitions of priority groups.

Outcomes

Grants SA invests in community organisations to:

Work directly with community to achieve one of the following outcomes:

- community members participate more fully in their community, are more connected to each other and to their community
- community members have improved skills and knowledge
- · community members have enhanced wellbeing and resilience

Strengthen organisational capacity toward one of the following outcomes:

- our organisation is better able to recruit, retain and improve the skills and knowledge of volunteers and members
- our organisation works better with the community and/or other organisations

What can be funded

The Department of Human Services (DHS) funds organisations for a maximum of 12 months to contribute to the Grants SA outcomes through:

- delivery of a one-off program or service
- delivery of a community or cultural event/project
- delivery of a community development activity
- activities that promote the recruitment and retention of volunteers and/or members
- learning and skill development opportunities for members of a community organisation and/or volunteers
- upgrades to community facilities
- equipment purchase
- vehicle purchase

Appendix 1 provides detailed descriptions of the types of activities that can be funded under each of the above categories.

Appendix 2 provides details of activities that will not be funded.

Who can apply

To be eligible, organisations must deliver services or support to the SA community. They must also be registered and operating within South Australian, not for profit, with a registered ABN and:

• incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Act 1985, or the Aboriginal Councils and Associations Act 1976, or certificate or evidence of comparable legal status,

or

 constituted under the South Australian Fire and Emergency Services Act, 2005, for example: Emergency sector organisations including Country Fire Service (CFS) brigades and State Emergency Services (SES) units,

or

 a council under the Local Government Act 1999; to sponsor an unincorporated community organisation, or engage a registered training organisation to deliver training for volunteers working in community organisations.

Organisations that are not incorporated or do not have an ABN can apply if they are able to secure an eligible organisation to act as their sponsor (auspice) for the project. The sponsor organisation is then responsible for submitting the application online, the legal and financial accountability of the project, and will be required to enter into the grant agreement. Sponsor organisations will receive funding and be responsible for acquitting funding.

Who is not eligible to apply?

Applications will not be accepted from organisations or sponsored organisations that:

- have outstanding acquittal reports for previously funded DHS projects
- · have licensed gaming machines in their facilities
- are educational institutions or related representative bodies e.g. schools and/or their parents' associations, universities and for profit childcare centres
- are trusts (excluding fixed trusts), individuals, or organisations applying on behalf of an individual
- are for-profit organisations or private companies
- are Commonwealth, State, or Local Government departments and agencies (except as a sponsor).

How to apply

 Ensure you apply at least three months prior to your activity or event commencing. If successful, your agreements will commence in 2018-19.

- Read the funding guidelines to determine whether your organisation meets the eligibility criteria for funding. If you are unsure, contact the Grants SA team on 1300 650 985.
- Complete the online application in full. Incomplete applications will be deemed ineligible.

Required documentation

- Quotes for items \$1,000 and over
- Award, level, hourly rate, weekly hours and length of employment, if applying for a salary
- Medium and major grants only most recent end of year financial report (does not apply to ACNC registered organisations if recent financial records are available on ACNC website)
- Facility upgrade grants only building owner consent, lease agreement and council approval if applicable. Please note: Council consent will not be accepted. Refer to page 10 for further specifications

Additional documentation

- If you are working with a particular population group or another organisation, you may be prompted to provide a support letter or evidence in the application process.
- Submit the completed application by the closing time and date. Late applications will not be accepted.

Note

- The funds sought by organisations generally exceed those available. As a result, you may
 not be successful in obtaining a grant or you may not be offered the full amount of money
 requested.
- Organisations can only apply once per round.
- Organisations or sponsored organisations are eligible to be successful for a maximum of three grants per financial year. There is no limit to the number of times an eligible organisation can sponsor other organisations.

Grants and the GST

• It is strongly recommended that applicants seek independent legal and financial advice to determine all taxation obligations before submitting an application. Please note that if your organisation's annual turnover is greater than \$150,000 (non-profit organisations), then you are required by the Australian Tax Office to be registered for the GST (www.ato.gov.au).

Successful applicants that are registered for GST will have their grant grossed up by 10% to offset the GST payable on the grant. Organisations that are not registered for the GST will not have their grant grossed up, and must include GST amounts in their application. If successful, organisations cannot have their Grant Agreement transferred to another body because of GST registration.

How applications are assessed

Stage one - application screening

Once the round has closed, the applications are screened to check that:

- the applicant organisation is eligible to apply
- the application has been completed in full and all essential information has been provided
- the applicant does not have any outstanding obligations for one-off projects funded by DHS.

Two criteria will be scored on the basis of information collected:

Value for money	The extent of value for money given the number of people who will directly benefit; the costs proposed are reasonable and realistic; level of complementary funding/in-kind support; and cost of comparable programs
Organisational capacity	The capacity of the organisation to carry out the proposed project. Engagement with a quality improvement program will be considered favourably

Applications that do not meet minimum stage one requirements will not be progressed to stage two.

Stage two – assessment against criteria

Applications that pass the screening process will be assessed by either of two panels with experience and expertise in one or more of the following areas – financial management, charitable or social welfare organisation administration, multicultural, young people and volunteering:

- For major and medium grants: a panel of up to seven community members and one DHS member.
- For minor grants: a panel of up to three DHS members and two community members.

The panels will assess the applications against the following criteria:

Community need	Evidence of need; level and type of community need being addressed; addresses priority population, and/or policy areas
Outcomes focus	The connection to a program outcome and the capacity of the project to meet the outcomes sought

Extent of benefit for the target group	The extent of benefit for the target group and South Australian community, taking into account the number of people and significant or long term benefits
Whole program funding distribution	The extent to which funding the project contributes to an equitable allocation of funding across target groups and geographic regions of South Australia

Notification of applicants

If your application is successful

Successful applicants will receive written notification from the Minister. You will then receive an agreement detailing the terms and conditions of the funding provided.

All applicants will be required to sign the agreement and comply with its conditions, which will include requirements to:

- report on how you have spent the money provided
- measure and report on the outcomes from the funded project where the funding is \$5,000 and over
- have public liability insurance a minimum of \$10 million or as required in your agreement
- appropriately acknowledge the State Government of South Australia as a funding source for the project

Payment will be made in accordance with the terms and conditions of the agreement.

If your application is unsuccessful

All ineligible or unsuccessful applicants will receive written notification from DHS.

Unsuccessful applicants are encouraged to contact the Grants SA team for feedback regarding their application.

Reporting requirements

On completion, you will need to sign a declaration that you have spent your funds in accordance with your agreement. You are required to keep receipts for all purchased items. Up to 10% of grant recipients will be audited annually.

If you receive more than \$5,000 through the major or medium rounds, you will be required to provide a short summary about the difference your project has made, including a description of project outcomes addressing the following performance measures:

- How much?
- How well?
- Is anyone better off?

Glossary

- Culturally and linguistically diverse groups and communities people within the South Australian community who share a common language, traditions or culture.
- **Disadvantage** Disadvantage is caused by issues related to discrimination, income, education, employment, housing, domestic and family violence and access to services and supports. These factors can create a complex web of challenges that limit people's access to life opportunities and their capacity to act on these opportunities.
- **Members** refers to those people who are members of community organisations eligible for a grant under the Grants SA program.
- Multicultural multiculturalism describes the cultural and ethnic diversity of South
 Australia. Multicultural grants aim to develop and strengthen our culturally and linguistically
 diverse communities, encourage cross-cultural awareness, and foster intercultural
 relationships, mutual respect, understanding and community unity.
- One-off a short-term project with a start and end date within a 12-month period.
- South Australian based office and staff located in South Australia.
- **Volunteers** volunteers give their time willingly for the common good and without financial gain.
- Young people refers to young people aged 12-25 years inclusive.

Descriptions and requirements of activities

- items, projects, programs or equipment that are already funded or are the core responsibility of other state and commonwealth government departments

Funding for individuals including:

- funds to distribute to individuals via sponsorships, scholarships, donations, financial assistance, reimbursement, uniforms
- volunteer honorariums, petrol expenses or other reimbursements
- emergency relief such as food vouchers, food, payment of bills, clothing, money



- personal pursuits, or hobbies
- funds to distribute to other bodies

KEY POINTS

- The Grants SA Minor Round 11 was open from 1 March 2018 to 31 March 2018. During this period, 80 applications were received requesting \$318,966.
- During the pre-eligibility check, 18 applications were deemed ineligible, due to the type of organisation/activity or missing documentation (attachment 1). The ineligible applicants were notified via email on 18 April 2018. One applicant withdrew their application.
- The total funding requested by the 61 eligible applicants was \$250,008.
- The total funding available to allocate for this round was \$101,932.

DISCUSSION

The Grants SA Minor Assessment Panel members individually assessed all 61 applications online, in accordance with the published Grants SA Guidelines.

The panel comprised four members: one representative from the South Australia Multicultural and Ethnic Affairs Commission (SAMEAC), Mr Hiep Nguyen and three Community Services Division staff members, Mr Rod Dolling, Ms Colleen Ross and Ms Nicole Lionnet.

On 19 April 2018, the Panel met to deliberate and recommended the allocation of \$101,562 (GST exclusive) in funding to 25 organisations (attachment 2).

Draft congratulatory letters have been prepared for your signature (attachment 3).

The Executive Director, Community Services Division, will sign letters of notification to the 36 unsuccessful applicants. A list of the unsuccessful applicants is attached for your information (Attachment 4).

There are no further Grants SA rounds for 2017-18.

The department is preparing a briefing, regarding the future of Grants SA program, which will be forwarded to your office for your consideration (18TDHS/097).
